The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.
- 4. Resolution #349-17A. Amend Resolution 349-17 to reflect a change in the bid opening date for the Kill Road Reconstruction Project. The date has been changed from June 30, 2017 to July 11, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. Commissioner Sneary moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Noonan. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.
- 5. Resolution #382-17. Authorize to post notice to bidders and advertise to receive bids for the Village of Lafayette W. Main St. and E. Sugar St. Improvements. The bid opening will be July 18, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. Commissioner Noonan moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Begg. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

#### A. Allen County Engineer

1. Resolution #383-17. Certify collection assessments for maintenance on various ditches to Allen County Auditor. Per Douglass Degen, there are 154 projects on a permanent maintenance program and the County Engineer is proposing to assess 145 of those projects this year. They can assess from 0% to 20%, but there is also a few projects being assessed over 20% because those monies will be utilized and expended by the end of the year. Commissioner Begg moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Sneary. The roll was called and the resolution

## was approved unanimously.

# B. Sanitary Engineer

- 2. Resolution #384-17. Approve Change Order #1 (Final) from Beaverdam Contracting, Inc. for the Lima Pallet Water and Sewer Project. Per Brad Niemeyer, the change order is in the amount of \$4,657.00 due to adjustments of bid quantities for a new contract amount not to exceed \$242,137.00. Commissioner Sneary moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Noonan. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.
- 3. Resolution #385-17. Accept bid and enter into contract with Miller Pipeline Corporation for the Allen County Holida West Sanitary Sewer Relining Project. Per Brad Niemeyer, the engineer's estimate for said project was approximately \$175,000.00 and the bid came in at \$163,840.75. The bids ranged from \$163,000.00 to \$255,000.00. Commissioner Noonan moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Begg. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.

4. Resolution #386-17. Authorize Subgrant Agreement between ODJFS and the Allen County Per Berlin Carroll, this is a Juvenile Court. renewal of a grant agreement to administer programs under Title IV-E. This agreement allows Juvenile Court to seek reimbursement placement of children and administration costs.
