- -Troy Elwer expressed appreciation to the Commissioners for their help in obtaining funding for this project

 - -if funding is granted, bleachers would be installed in 2025

 - -ticket sales are steady

There are currently three (3) dogs in training for basic obedience, crate training and socialization to make them more desirable for adoption once training is completed. Four (4) have already been adopted this month. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.

B. Sanitary Engineer

1. 1.Resolution #353-24. Authorize the Sanitary Engineering Department purchase one (1) 2025 Freightliner 114SD Conventional Chassis Semi Tractor through Stoops Freightliner Lima, as per the Ohio Department of Transportation Purchase Program Contract #023-24. Commissioner Winegardner moved for approval. Motion seconded by Commissioner Noonan. This vehicle will replace the current 2006 Freightliner. New vehicle will not be received until early fall, and the 2006 will be sold then. The roll was called and the resolution was approved unanimously.
